Point Man and Gray Ghost CAVALRY PROJECT

Here's a teaser of what Gray Ghost and Point Man are working on for this year's Ft. Thomas show. The dynamic duo are putting together an old west town as a background for a 6th Cavalry unit that they are building. The unit includes a supply wagon with mule team and a support contingent of mounted cavalry troopers. So far they have ten troopers put together and more are on the way. The town will include

false fronts for a livery, a bank, a saloon and general store. It will be filled with cowboys and townspeople going about their daily business as the cavalry rolls down the main street. Probably the most daunting part of the project will be all of the horses that have to be painted and detailed with saddles and harnesses. It promises to be an interesting display though and you will not want to miss seeing it up close and personal this November!




